Our foster program gives cats and kittens a safe, supportive home environment while they wait for adoption. Fosters play a critical role in socialization, healing, and preparing cats for their forever families.

COMMUNITY SUPPORT

We provide vital resources—like food, supplies, and guidance—to help families care for their cats through tough times. Our goal is to keep pets with the people who love them, whenever possible.

EDUCATION

Through our education program, we partner with local libraries and community spaces to offer learning sessions and activities that teach responsible, compassionate cat care and safe interactions with cats.

KIERA FINDS HER FOREVER

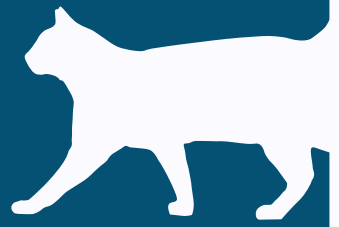
Kiera's journey began in March 2025, when a pregnant stray found under a bridge was brought to Town Cats by a compassionate passerby.

What we hoped would be a smooth transition into motherhood instead became a difficult chapter marked by a traumatic birth and deep fear, causing Kiera to retreat and remain withdrawn for months. Despite the dedication of our team, her FIV+ diagnosis and timid nature made it challenging for her to find a home.

Entering foster care for the first time was a game-changer for Kiera. Within hours, she began to transform, exploring, playing, and showing glimpses of trust, revealing the loving cat we always believed she could be. With time, patience, and a safe environment,

Kiera continued to blossom—and in November 2025, she found her forever home. Her story is a powerful reminder that healing takes time, and every step forward can lead to a life transformed.

DAME'S STORY

Dame's story came full circle in 2025. Originally adopted from Town Cats as a kitten in 2013, we were surprised to learn she had been found years later living in a feral colony.

In partnership with another Bay Area rescue, we were able to bring her back into our care, provide the medical attention she needed, and ensure she was safe once again.

Now thriving in a foster home, Dame is rediscovering comfort and stability as she waits for her next chapter. Her journey is a powerful reflection of our lifelong commitment to the cats we serve—no matter where life takes them, we are always there to help them find their way back to safety.
